Patrick is a three-term Bradenton City Councilman and former Vice Mayor who began his political career following a long tenure of citizen activism. Patrick moved into Ware's Creek neighborhood 30 years ago and helped turn the Ware's Creek Flood Control Project, which had been stalled for 25 year, into a reality. Before and since the flood control project was completed, he has been recognized by Keep Manatee Beautiful for the biannual Ware's Creek Cleanups he has led.

Since taking office, Patrick has served as Chair or President of the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council, Manasota League of Cities, Manatee-Sarasota Metropolitan Planning Organization. He served on the USF Advisory Council, Sarasota-Bradenton Regional Airport Advisory Board, Manatee County Public Library Board, and a number of community boards.

Patrick attended the Florida Redevelopment Academy to become a certified redevelopment professional and has been instrumental in the evolution of the City such as Riverwalk Park, the "Pink Hotel" into the Hampton Inn & Suites, John & Rebecca Neal Park community garden & kayak launch, Manatee Performing Arts Center, Marriott Springhill Suites, Twin Dolphin Marina expansion, and the remodeling of LECOM Field.
